¿Cómo verificar la "public key" en el apt-get de debian?

Si al intentar hacer un *apt-get update* nos muestra el siguiente error:

```
Debian:~# apt-get update
```

```
W: There are no public key available for the following key IDs: B5D0C804ADB11277
```

El problema se corrige:

```
Debian:~# gpg --recv-key --keyserver wwwkeys.eu.pgp.net B5D0233ADB11277
```
